All English

can have their
cume reviewed for
possible access to
the GATE
Program

Based on the
recommendation of the
school, the Extensions and
Interventions Programs
Coordinator (EIPC) and
English Language Programs
Coordinator (ELPC) review
the student's file

Based on attendance, grades, test
scores, etc. the student is not
recommended for the GATE Program

Students New to
TTUSD

All students new to
TTUSD can be
evaluated for GATE
services at the family's
request

If the student has
already been
GATE identified in

If the student has
not been GATE
identified in
another California
school or in
Washoe County

Student is eligible
to take the OLSAT
exam for
identification
purposes (if s/he
is in 3rd grade or
older)
